

FoMS Bioinformatics Workshop Series

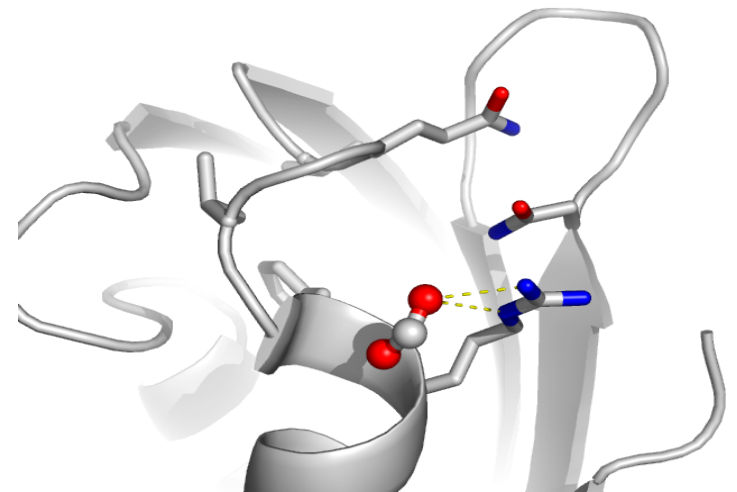
What is our goal?

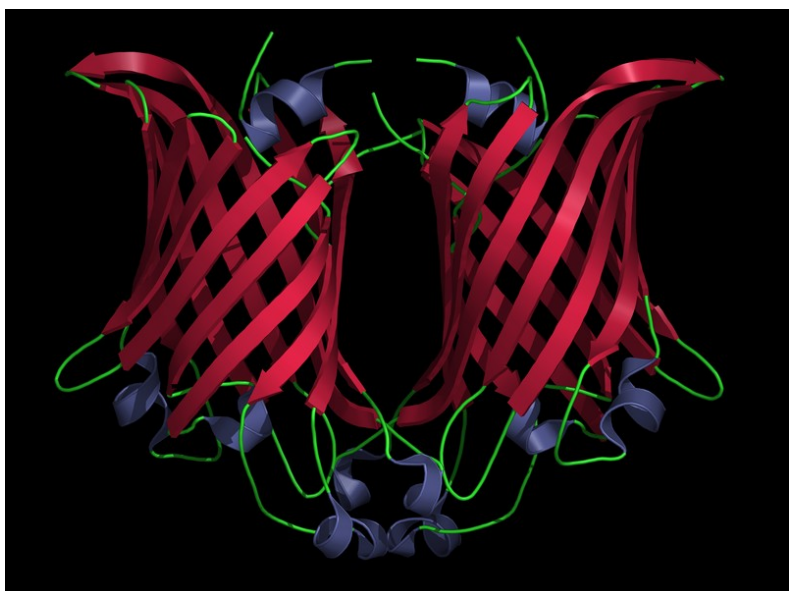
Workshop #2
